## EDITORIAL

The ballot of the BTF membership in June last year decided that Trampolining should become a discipline of British Gymnastics. This means that Trampolining will be organised by a National Trampoline Technical Committee (TTC) which consist of six persons. Each member of this committee has specific responsibilities for competitions, judging events, judging education, coaching, world class liaison, with myself as the Chair.

Within the British Gymnastics organisation structure each Region/Home Nation will have its own Technical Committee, responsible for the organisation within that Region – in a similar fashion to the old BTF Divisional Committee.

To enable each Regional Technical Committee to be given up to date Trampoline information, the TTC intends to produce a Newsletter every two months, beginning with this April edition. We hope that this will encourage good communication practices and give an indication of the progress being made by each of its members.

There are two vital pieces of information that the TTC requires from each Region/Home National Technical Committees this year.

- An indication of how each Region/Home Nation would suggest the financial level of membership fees that are acceptable within that area.
- Suggest nominations for the six National Trampoline Technical Committee seats as described earlier, in July of this year.

I am certain that Trampolinists will very quickly adopt to the organisational structure of British Gymnastics; and hopefully be able to participate fully as the newest discipline.

## NEWS FLASH

The sport of Trampolining has been confirmed as a discipline in the Programme of the Athens Olympic Games in 2004. The FIG TR-CO have still to work out the criterion for entry. Hopefully, we can arrive at a much better system of selection than that for Sydney, to everyone's satisfaction! **Ed.**

## INTERNATIONAL NEWS

A four year international Programme has been put together in an effort to ensure that officials, coaches, judges and gymnasts are kept abreast of our future plans. As well as catering for the seniors there are a number of planned youth internationals also, including the introduction in 2001 of an annual Home Countries Youth International.

We have also had tentative acceptance of a visit from both the Russian Federation, in 2001, and the Canadians in 2002 for international matches. The Russian match will most probably be held in Cardiff in June, and will consist of both trampoline and tumbling events. The venue/date for the visit of the Canadians in 2002 is still to be arranged.

During the current year, the GBR v GER Youth international has been arranged for **30 Sep** in the town of **Duisburg**. 4 x officials and 20 x gymnasts will be involved.

The World Cup in **Guildford** on **24 Jun** should be a show piece for the sport, with entries having been received from all over the world, including current world champions. As well as a number of those selected for the **Sydney Olympics**, participating. If you do not already have a ticket for this event, these can be obtained from the following source:

## JUDGING MATTERS

An **Intercontinental Judges Course** is scheduled for **Bratislava SVK** over the period **27-31 January 2001**. The Intercontinental courses are run every four years (Olympic Cycle) when 23 candidates from each federation attend the course, followed by the examination. At the end of the examination, those candidates who are successful then organise judges courses/examinations in their own countries, assisted by members of the FIG TR-CO. For the 2001 course, both **Mike Phillipson** and I will hopefully travel to Bratislava, returning to run a course in mid February, for all current holders of the FIG Brevet, as well as for those sitting the judges examination for the first time.

## COMPETITIONS

### ELIGIBILITY

From 1 April 2000, all competitive Trampoline activity came under British Gymnastics. The National Competition Committee sent out a letter to this effect during the month of February, defining the rules for eligibility to compete in British Gymnastics Trampoline Competitions. This was circulated to all BTF Central Council members, British Gymnastics, as well as all clubs with registered competitors in 1999, Regions/Home Nations and Competition Secretaries.

To compete in British Gymnastics Graded 3 to 6 competitions, all competitors must be at least an Associate Member of British Gymnastics, or registered to a Home Nation. Proof that the club has at least had their registration received by either British Gymnastics or the Home Nation will be acceptable. If this is not complied with, then the competitor will not be allowed to compete, and the entry fee will be retained.
