WAGCs 2009 St Petersburg RUS

Sharon Wood has recently been appointed to oversee the arrangements for British Gymnastics entry to this event. Sharon will also act as Head of Delegation for the British team.

An initial planning meeting was recently held to discuss travel, accommodation, selection policies, chaperones, team uniform as well as numerous other details. The meeting was attended by representatives of both the ACRO and Trampoline Technical Committees, as well as staff of BG.

Details regarding the Selection Policy will be issued shortly, along with costs, travel details and VISA requirements.

FIG Council - Official News

Cape Town (RSA), May 2008

The FIG Council has accepted modifications and updates to the **Technical Regulations** as proposed by the Executive.

Among these:

- **new qualifying process** for athlete qualification to the Olympic Games. In the future, two events will serve as qualifying events: the world championships organised the year preceding the Olympic Games and pre-Olympic events.
- the **elimination** of world cup finals as of 1st January 2009. From this time forward, Olympic FIG disciplines will benefit from a world championship annually, with the exception of OG years.
- addition of the **Youth Olympic Games** and regulations to the list of official FIG competitions, as well as the addition of the **African Games**.
- scorekeeping **terminology**. **A** refers to **Artistic**, **E** to **Execution**, **D** to **Difficulty/Content** and **S** to **Synchronisation** in all FIG disciplines.
- from **1st January 2009** any senior or junior gymnasts wishing to participate in an international competition will need a **license** to do so.
- a new **FIG Internet** website will make its debut in July 2008.

Victory in Vila do Conde Four Nations 2008

GBR trampolinists **Emma Britton, Stacey Dann, Daniel Greaves, Jack Helme, Emma Smith** and **Steven Williams**, supported by coaches **Sue Bramble** and **Joy Scouler**, **Physio Amberin Fur** and **Claire Thompson**, Head of Delegation, set out for **Vila do Conde**, near **Oporto, Portugal** on Friday 13 June for the annual Four Nations competition.

Close to Oporto, Vila do Conde was the venue for the WAGC in 1994 and EC/EYC in 1998.

Competing with the Czech Republic, Denmark and Portugal, for the officials it was a case of renewing old acquaintances and catching up with friends of many years. For the competitors, young teams from all four countries were selected to gain experience en-route to full senior competition. There were names on each team we will see again at a high level in future competitions, judging on the performance given.

Organised as the best of four routines across three rounds, GBR lead at the end of the preliminaries based on solid set routine performances from the team and competitive difficulty levels in the voluntary. FIG A and FIG B set routines were equated by awarding no difficulty for FIG A performers. DEN, CZE and POR followed close behind.

A push for places on the podium of all countries caused a few thrills and spills in the final round. GBR and POR kept their placing, while the CZE five person team pipped DEN to take second place.

Final result **GBR 1st (374.2)**, **DZE 2nd (366.8)**, **DEN 3rd (365.9)** and **POR 4th (358.2)**.

All GBR team members' scores contributed to a super team effort.

Hosted by the local club, supported by the town mayor and managed by the Portuguese Federation, this was a friendly well matched competition. The GBR team was complimented for its appearance, conduct and performance at all times.

Our thanks go to the Portuguese, who were fabulous hosts and organisers.

Both the CDS and the FIG recognise the pre-existing, unique relationship between athletes and their national sport entity, a relationship which earlier allowed these gymnasts to reach the highest level.

The joint objective of the CDS and the FIG is to co-ordinate efforts geared toward assisting athletes in the decisional process, whilst at the same time respecting the rules and ethical principles of sporting competitions with all transparency; and bearing in mind that both parties are founded on the pursuit of excellence.

British Gymnastics appoint Olympic Performance Director



British Gymnastics are delighted to announce that **Tim Jones** has joined the organisation, in his role as **Olympic Performance Director**, who will be responsible for the **World Class Programmes in Men's Artistic, Women's Artistic and Trampoline Gymnastics**.

Tim joins British Gymnastics from UK Athletics where he was the **Manager of the Loughborough HIPAC (High Performance Athletics Centre)** and was responsible for the performance programmes of around forty World Class Athletes.

Tim said: *"It is a really great time to become involved in British Gymnastics, the trend of recent results is suggesting that we have the policies in place to convert some positive junior performances into consistent medals at Major Championships, including the Olympic Games. My challenge post Beijing, will be to look at the systems in place, bring in some of my own learning experiences. And more importantly, ensure that we continue to go from strength to strength."*

Brain Stocks, British Gymnastics CEO said: "It's fantastic having Tim Jones on board, having someone come in from another sport gives us another dimension. We have the technical expertise to deliver the results, but having someone on board who has lived and driven the Olympic programme in another sport will give us a new approach and a new way of moving forward looking for more great results in the future."

Tim also had overall responsibility for the Paralympics Athletic Team and will still accompany them to the Games in Beijing this summer. Tim is formerly a National Coach in swimming and has run high performance swimming programmes in Birmingham and Edinburgh.

The World Cup in Loule POR will be the first event in the 2009 World Cup series held under the new 2009 World Cup Rules, where gymnasts will be able to collect world cup points ranging from 50 points for 1st place to 6 points for 16th place.

Points will be allocated as follows:

Places 17 to 30 will receive 1 point.

The Winner of the World Cup Series 2009 will be the gymnast / pair with the highest points obtained in all available World Cup events **minus** 2 events (minimum 3 events). In case of a tie, the number of points obtained in the last competition will decide.

A special ceremony will be held at the last tournament for the overall winner in **TUM, TRA Synchronised** and **TRA**.

Prize Money will be allocated according to the following Ranking:

1st Place: SFR 2000

2nd Place: SFR 1200

3rd Place: SFR800

In an effort to maintain uniformity for each of the World Cup events, the FIG TR TC have decided on the following programme that all OCs must adhere to:

Day 1: Arrival of the Delegations

Day 2: Training and Podium Training

Day 3: Qualification Round TRA, TUM, TRA Synchronised
